we think we already know.*





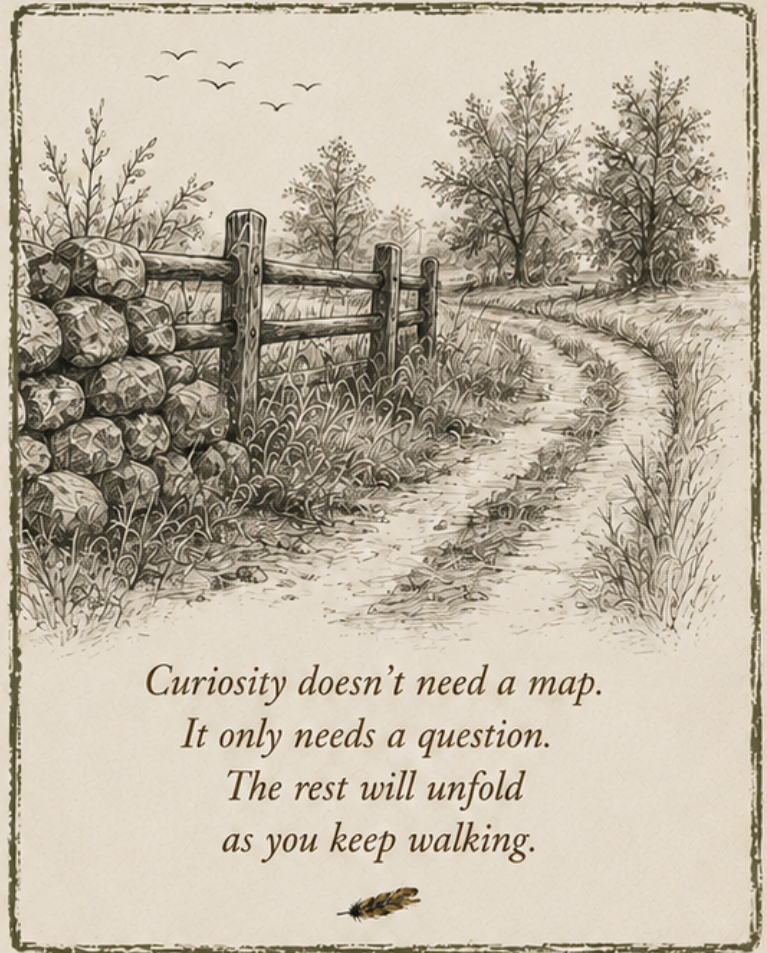
Following Your Curiosity



THE INVITATION

As you walk, don't try to solve anything.
Don't search for something impressive.
Simply notice what catches your attention.
Trust your curiosity more than your expectations.

The rest will unfold
as you keep walking.*



*Little things can lead to big discoveries.
Follow the thread.*



FOLLOW THE THREAD

You noticed something.
Now stay with it.

Ask:

- What is it?
- Why is it here?
- Has it always been here?
- Who depends on it?
- What changed?
- What questions does it raise?

You don't need to answer every question.
You only need to follow the one that
makes you curious enough to keep going.

THERE IS NO WRONG DISCOVERY

Sometimes you'll learn the history of a bridge.
